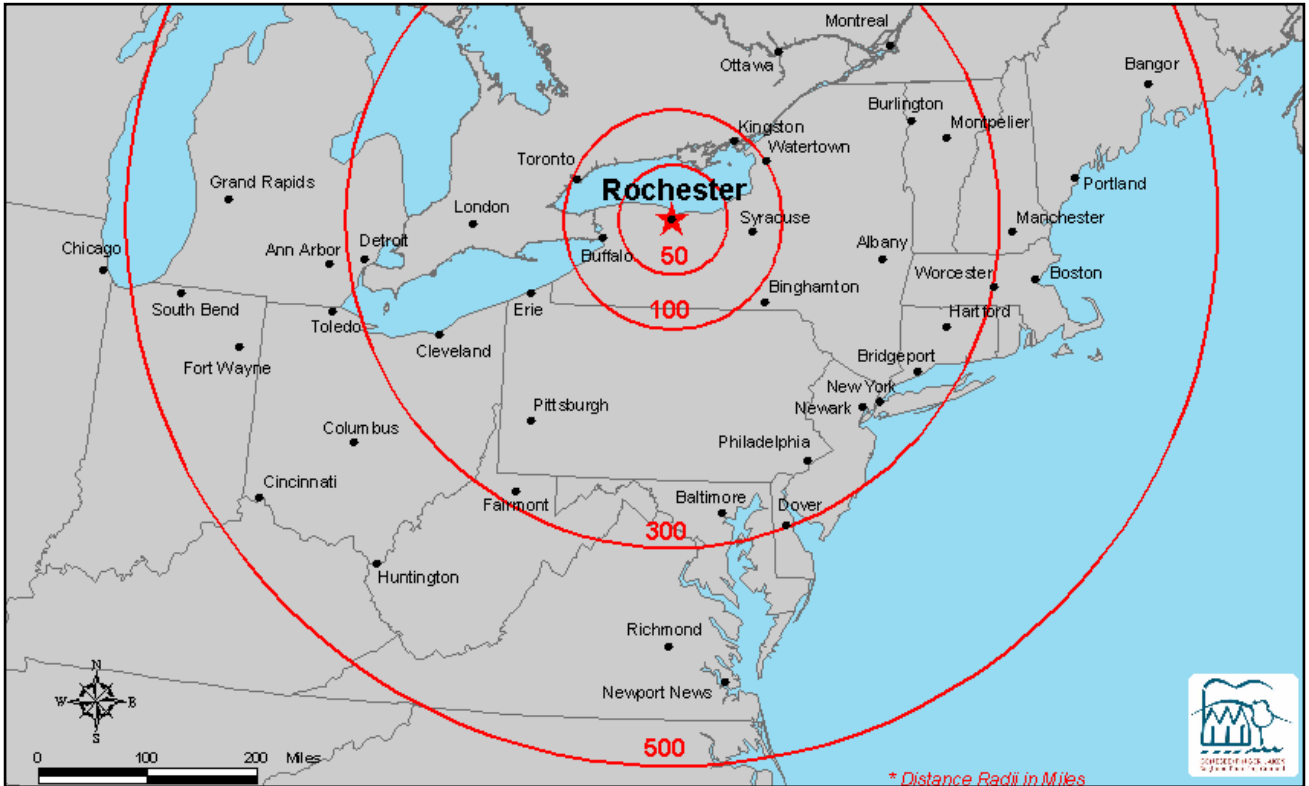

## Ground, Rail, and Water Transportation Access

**Rochester was ranked 3rd among 25 peer cities for 'Least Congested Freeway Lane Miles'**

### Ground

Rochester is located within a seven hour drive of Baltimore, Boston, Cleveland, Columbus, Detroit, Hartford, New York City, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, and Washington, D.C., Three major Canadian cities, Toronto, Ottawa, and Montreal, are also within a seven hour drive from the Greater Rochester Region.

### Bus

With over 50 routes, **Rochester-Genesee Regional Transportation Authority (RGRTA)** provides on-line bus service to seven counties in the Rochester Region (Monroe, Ontario, Genesee, Wyoming, Livingston, Seneca, and Wayne counties).

### Rail

Freight Carriers:

**Three Class I Carriers:** CSX is the largest railroad in the eastern US, and operates the Water Level Route (Buffalo-New York City). Norfolk Southern operates in 22 states, linking numerous ports and connecting customers to markets worldwide. Canadian Pacific operates the Southern Tier Route (Buffalo-Newark, NJ) with Norfolk Southern and provides a rail network of over 14,000 miles in the US and Canada.

**Ten Class III short line railroads** provide services throughout the region for a variety of purposes.

Passenger Service:

There are over 50 weekly **Amtrak** departures from Rochester Station.

**Railroad route capacity is about 50 to 60 freight/passenger trains per day.**

### Water

Rochester is within close proximity to the **Great Lakes St. Lawrence Seaway System**, giving the City seaport access.

The **Spirit of Ontario I**, nicknamed "The Cat," is the high speed, fast ferry service connecting Rochester, New York and Toronto, Ontario. The ship shuttles between the two cities daily, carrying up to 750 people, 220 vehicles, and up to 10 buses or trucks. Making approximately 2 round-trip journeys daily, the ferry takes two hours and fifteen minutes to navigate between ports.
